Since last year I have been urging our club to celebrate St. Boniface Day, observed on 05 June. I'm not asking for a religious observance, mind you, but as descendants

of Germans he's a very important person.

Our club has no problem celebrating St. Patrick's Day every year along with Cinco De Mayo. Neither of these observances has anything to do with Germany or Germans. It seems like we observe these events because it's a chance to enjoy good food and celebrate at the club.

Well, enter St. Boniface. Who was he? He's known as the Apostle to the Germans. In other words, he was a Benedictine monk who was sent as a missionary to Germany. He was born about 675 A.D. in England. His given name was Winfred. He first left for the Continent in 716 arriving at Utrecht. Sometime that year he set out on a missionary expedition to Frisia. Frisia is in northwest Germany and goes into the northern Netherlands. There is a chain of islands that belong to Frisia. Frisia is now part of Schleswig-Holstein. He was not very successful in converting the Frisians to Christianity and in 754, and while working with converts, he was confronted by armed robbers who thought him wealthy and killed him.

You might wonder why I am telling you this story. First, he was a missionary to pagan people, just like St. Patrick. Second, he was also martyred for his faith. Third, and perhaps most interesting to those of us in Terre Haute is the fact that a good many German immigrants to our city were from Frisia! Some of these immigrants were instrumental in founding Immanuel Evangelical Lutheran Church. Descendants still live in our community. St. Boniface's fest day is celebrated in the Roman Catholic Church, the Evangelical Lutheran Church, the Anglican Church, and the Eastern Orthodox Church, so you see he must have been quite important. His remains are said to be in Fulda, Germany. There is a statue of him in Mainz.

It seems fitting that we should raise a "Prost!" to this missionary to the Germans and enjoy some good German food! After all, if it hadn't been for Boniface there might be no such history of German Christians in Terre Haute! Please join us on Saturday, 06/10/23, for our St. Boniface Day Dinner & Dance.
