## FROM THE President

While many have already packed away their Christmas decorations [some even on 26 December], the celebration of Christ's birth continues until 06 January, the twelfth day of Christmas, or as it is on the liturgical calendar, Epiphany. A traditional Epiphany is celebrated in the German states of Baden-Württemberg. Bavaria, and Saxony-Anhalt, where it is a public holiday. [Editor's note: holiday is a shortened form of holy day, a religious observance. Few people make the connection. Vacations are said to be "on holiday."]

The word Epiphany comes from the Greek. It means to "show forth" or manifest. The Savior is manifested to Gentiles. In the above name German states, it is called *Dreikönigsfest*, or "The Three Kings," who are seen as the Magi, or Wise Men, who come to visit the infant Jesus. Children often dress as the three kings and act as Sternsingers [Star Singers] going door to door caroling and collecting money for charity. It was customary for homes and stables to burn incense as a sign of cleansing [from sin]. Homes which did this were marked with a chalk "C+M+B" for the traditional names of the Magi [Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar], and the date were be written on the house, for example, 2024: 20\*C+M+B\*24.

On the day before, 05 January, families and friends gathered and toasted the New Year by tapping a keg of *Bockbier*, which is a strong Bier. In these states the celebration would conclude with a Gottesdienst [Mass] with a very prominent Krippe [crib] with the children acting out the Christmas account.

At the cathedral in Köln [if you've never visited this magnificent sanctuary you



absolutely must!], it is said that they have the relics [bones] of the three kings. So, this place has a certain place of honor for the three kings. It took over 600 years to complete and is constantly being renovated. My wife and I attended an organ concert in this cathedral and the reverberation was a full 10 seconds! During WW II

At other venues in January winter sports take center stage. There is a New Year's Ski Jump at Garmisch-Partenkirchen in the Alps. Preliminary jumps take place on 31 December and the finals take place on 01 January. Of course, skiing and other Alpine events are very popular and we often see these on TV.

In Berlin you can't ski or toboggan, but you can run in the *Berliner Neujahrslauf* (New Years Run). It's a mere 4 kilometers [2.5] miles. It starts at the Brandenburg Gate and goes past many famous sites in Berlin. If that isn't your thing you can go to Leipzig for the *Motorad Messe*, one of the largest motorcycle fairs in the world. Be warned! BMW makes some of the world's finest motorcycles. These are called *Beemers*, in distinction from the automobiles from the same manufacturer, which are called *Bimmers*.
