How much does it cost a month to keep the doors open at the Club?

This question frequently comes up at membership and event planning

meetings. Based on the 12-month period covering 03/01/23 – 03/31/24 the Club's average nondiscretionary <u>monthly</u> expenses (i.e. utilities, insurance, facility maintenance, trash removal, lawncare, tax preparation, etc.) were \$1,330.00. These expenses do not include costs associated with dinners and other events (i.e. Oktoberfest, vendor events, etc.), paying state and local taxes on income generated by events, annual liquor license cost, unexpected equipment or facilities repairs, or the Club's scholarship program.
